

Public Funds in Schools

Public funds are defined, in part, to include all monies derived from tuition charges, from collections for lost or damaged property of the Board of Education, from collections for home economics food supplies, from fees, from fines assessed in connection with the use of books, equipment, or other facilities of the Board of Education and from the operation of lunchrooms and other food services.

Public funds are further defined to include all monies derived from production sales, from operation of the laundry, library, and sanitary supply services, from fees or other charges for supplies or other expenses incurred in connection with any assembly program or any class for instruction in any school subject. The Superintendent may classify other funds as public funds.

Any charge or assessment, the proceeds of which become a part of a public fund in schools, shall be separate from all other fees and charges, and the records of receipts shall provide a detailed classification of such charges or assessments.

No payments or transfers of any kind shall be made by any school cashier from public funds in schools.
