BE SAFE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Stay in assigned area. Obey laws regarding smoking for minors. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Trespassing Tobacco/Smoking 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Re-teach the behavioral expectations Create a behavior contract that includes expected student behaviors, as well as consequences for infractions and incentives for demonstrating expected behaviors Require the student to complete a community service task Have the student choose a method of apologizing or making amends to those harmed or offended Provide a reflective activity Refer to intervention assistance team Office referral Detention, during which the student completes work In-school suspension time, during which school work is completed Time in an Alternative to Suspension program while support plans are developed File charges if law is broken Restitution
